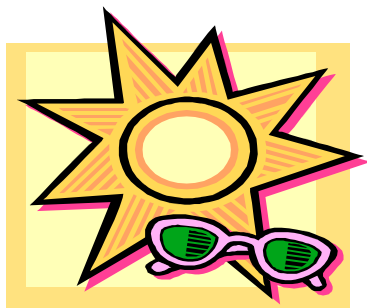
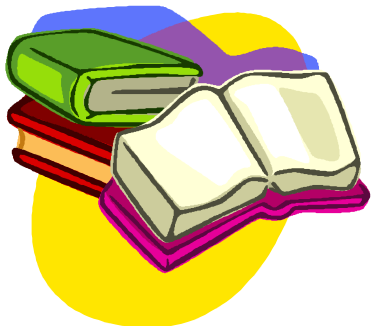


# Summer Reading Sophomores

## **Rationale:**

A common question that many college students struggle with is “what am I going to do in my life?” Many authors have answered this question, but few have evaluated calling from a Christian perspective. In this book, the author addresses the issues of calling by evaluating “the biblical, Reformation teaching about the doctrine of vocation, emphasizing not what we should specifically do with our time or what careers we are called to, but what God does in and through our callings.” This book will be instrumental in sophomore orientation sessions as we evaluate our calling now as students and our future callings as workers, family leaders, citizens, and church members.

## **Assignment:**

1. Read the book
2. Keep a reading log. The reading log should include at least 10 entries of about 1 paragraph each. The log can be completed in whatever way works best for you -- notebook, computer, etc.
3. Feel free to write about any aspect of the reading, but you may want to reflect on these questions to start your comments. What was the most significant thing that the author said in this chapter? What new insight did you learn from the chapter? What questions are still unanswered for you? What was your favorite quote from the chapter?
